### **Parking**

### **Cellphones**


In line with the new government rules about cellphones in school. Students at Woodlands are not to bring cellphones to school or on EOTC events - they do not need them and you can contact the office if you need to talk to the children.

# **Healthy Food Guidelines**

At Woodlands Full Primary School, we:

- ensure that any food or drink provided by/through the school (e.g. in class or sold at school) aligns with national food and nutrition guidelines, such as <u>Healthy Food and Drink Guidance – Schools</u>
- incorporate nutrition education across the curriculum, including the health programme
- encourage staff to model healthy food and drink choices
- provide nutrition messages and food that acknowledges the diversity of our community and considers those with special dietary needs (e.g. allergies and intolerances, and religious, cultural, and ethical food requirements)
- consider our nutrition messages when deciding on food provided by the school (e.g. class rewards and celebrations, student prizes, special events, fundraising activities, and school camp menus)
- actively promote physical activity as the partner of good nutrition
- encourage students taking part in physical activity to drink water for hydration and to refuel with healthy snacks.

Last year during our consultation process - it was decided we were WATER ONLY. This means no juice boxes or Up & Go drinks are to come to school in lunchboxes (this excludes events outside of the normal school hours).



**Heat Ups** - we do have a pie warmer to heat items up. This must come in a container that can be heated in the pie warmer. No plastic containers.

# Learning @ Woodlands!





This is where we have our Policies and Procedures. They include different expectations for the school and the Board of Trustees follow an annual review schedule to ensure that these match what we are doing here at Woodlands School.

#### Administering medication

The school will not administer medication to a student without formal parental consent. However, non-prescription paracetamol may be given with verbal consent and instruction on the appropriate dosage from a parent.

Parents are asked to administer student medication outside school hours when possible. If a student requires medication during school hours, we only administer prescription medication to students whose parents/caregivers have completed a **medicine authority form**. Forms are stored appropriately and health information is kept private. Medication is administered with due care and attention to the instructions. We carefully monitor some medication in particular (e.g. mood/behaviour altering drugs) so parents/caregivers can be assured it is being taken as prescribed.

We observe the following guidelines when administering medicines.


- · All medication held by the school is administered through the school office.
- · Staff with authority to administer medication on behalf of parents/caregivers keep appropriate records and store medication safely.
- To ensure the safe management of medication:
  - · all medication given to students is recorded
  - the record shows the name of the student, the dose given, the time and date given, the person administering and any other action taken.
- If a staff member requires school-supplied pain relief, it is only given by someone who is medically trained to do so, otherwise the staff member self-administers the medicine.

When needed, we consult a parent/caregiver or health professional (e.g. doctor, public health nurse) as soon as practicable. In an emergency, we provide **first aid** and call emergency services as required. Medication is administered according to the student's **health plan** if provided.

Please note, you do not need to send any paracetamol to school. We have some here (liquid and pill form). We will always check permissions first before administering and also send you a text to let you know too.

If your child has cough drops or something of this nature, you need to email the class teacher to make them aware.

### **Concerns and Complaints Process**



NOTE: Unless there are exceptional circumstances, a complaint will not be considered unless the correct process has been followed. You may be directed back to the staff member or principal to follow the process.

Once a formal complaint has been resolved, there are no further avenues to pursue the complaint with the school.

If you are not satisfied with the outcome of your complaint, you are encouraged to take advice and may wish to consider contacting other agencies. See the school's **Making a Formal Complaint or Serious Allegation** procedure (SchoolDocs).


